THE MOTHER OF ALL EXAMINATIONS

The Civil Services Examination is a highly competitive and comprehensive examination in India conducted by the UPSC (Union Public Service Commission) for the recruitment of candidates into various services of the Indian government. The examination process is extensive and typically spans a whole year, inclusive of the Preliminary Examination, which is Objective Type. Candidates who clear the Preliminary Exam will take the Main Examination, which is Descriptive in nature. After the mains, candidates have to go through the Interview (Personality Test) process; after which, the final merit list is prepared based on the candidate's performance in the main examination and the interview.

Part - B (Main Examination)

QUALIFYING PAPERS ON INDIAN LANGUAGES AND ENGLISH

The aim of the paper is to test the candidates' ability to read and understand serious discursive prose, and to express his ideas clearly and correctly, in English and Indian language concerned.

1) Indian language/ Paper A – Compulsory for all candidates except those hailing from Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Sikkim, Manipur, Mizoram, and Meghalaya. The candidates have to select one of the Indian Language from the Languages included in the Eighth Schedule of the Indian Constitution.

The pattern of questions would be broadly as follow:

- (i) Comprehension of given passages.
- (ii) Precise Writing.
- (iii) Usage and Vacabulary.
- (iv) Short Essays.
- (v) Translation from English to the Indian Language and vice-versa.
- 2) English language/ Paper B Compulsory for all candidates.

The pattern of questions would be broadly as follow:

- (i) Comprehension of given passages.
- (ii) Precise Writing.
- (iii) Usage and Vacabulary.
- (iv) Short Essays.

Note: The papers on Indian Languages and English will be of Matriculation or equivalent standard and will be of qualifying nature only (25%). The marks obtained in these papers will not be counted for ranking.

MAINS PAPER - 1 (ESSAY PAPER)

Candidates may be required to write essays on multiple topics. They will be expected to keep closely to the subject of the essay to arrange their ideas in orderly fashion, and to write concisely. Credit will be given for effective and exact expression.

(Indian Heritage and Culture, History and Geography of the World and Society)

- Indian culture will cover the salient aspects of Art Forms,
 Literature and Architecture from ancient to modern times.

- The Freedom Struggle its various stages and important contributors / contributions from different parts of the country.

- Aptitude and foundational values for Civil Service, integrity, impartiality and non-partisanship, objectivity, dedication to public service, empathy, tolerance and compassion towards the weaker-sections.
- Emotional intelligence-concepts, and their utilities and application in administration and governance.
- · Contributions of moral thinkers and philosophers from India and world.
- Public/Civil service values and Ethics in Public administration: Status and problems; ethical concerns and dilemmas in government and private institutions; laws, rules, regulations and conscience as sources of ethical guidance; accountability and ethical governance; strengthening of ethical and moral values in governance; ethical issues in international relations and funding; corporate governance.
- Probity in Governance: Concept of public service; Philosophical basis of governance and probity; Information sharing and transparency in government, Right to Information, Codes of Ethics, Codes of Conduct, Citizen's Charters, Work culture, Quality of service delivery, Utilization of public funds, challenges of corruption.

Interview Test:

The candidate will be interviewed by a Board who will have before them a record of his career. He will be asked questions on matters of general interest. The object of the interview is to assess the personal suitability of the candidate for a career in public service by a Board of competent and unbiased observers. The test is intended to judge the mental caliber of a candidate.

In broad terms this is really an assessment of not only his intellectual qualities but also social traits and his interest in current affairs. Some of the qualities to be judged are mental alertness, critical powers of assimilation, clear and logical exposition, balance of judgment, variety and depth of interest, ability for social cohesion and leadership, intellectual and moral integrity.

The technique of the interview is not that of a strict cross-examination but of a natural, though directed and purposive conversation which is intended to reveal the mental qualities of the candidate.

The interview test is not intended to be a test either of the specialised or general knowledge of the candidates which has been already tested through their written papers. Candidates are expected to have taken an intelligent interest not only in their special subjects of academic study but also in the events which are happening around them both within and outside their own State or Country as well as in modern currents of thought and in new discoveries which should rouse the curiosity of well educated youth.

Ranking and Service Allocation:

The final ranking determines the service allocation for successful candidates. The top-ranked candidates get their preferred choices among the various civil services like IAS (Indian Administrative Service), IPS (Indian Police Service), IFS (Indian Foreign Service), etc.
